

FRIDAY MEMO

January 13, 2006

1. The Board of County Commissioners took action to cancel the Clearwater project at its January 12, 2006 regular meeting. In addition, it established a Citizen Advisory Committee (CAC) within Clackamas County Service District No. 1 and charged it to study wastewater options and report back to the Board of Commissioners (BCC) by September 30, 2006. The CAC that was created was different from that the BCC had first proposed. Rather than the ten members with five voting members, the CAC will be a seven-member committee. All members will have a vote. A quorum of five members is required to conduct business, and "recommendations from the CAC to the Board shall require a super-majority of five affirmative votes of the members of the CAC." The three chief petitioners are members of the CAC, with the remaining members appointed by the BCC from a list recommended by the chief petitioners. The Board Order creating the CAC also requires that it "utilize the services of the Portland State University Consensus Center, to assist in the development of the strategic plan for wastewater treatment facilities . . ." All three Board members as well as one of the chief petitioners—James Knapp—cited the need for inclusion and consensus. We have scheduled a discussion of next steps during the January 17, 2006 Council work session.
2. North Main Village (at the old Safeway site downtown) is progressing on schedule and the projected completion date is December, 2007. The foundation for the elevator shaft for the northwest corner apartments has been poured; walls are beginning to take shape; and the foundation is being prepared for the condominiums facing Main Street. 3. At the request of the City's Parks Board, Historic Milwaukie, Lake Road, and Island Station Neighborhood Associations are discussing a proposed name for the Kellogg property on McLoughlin Blvd. Dena Swanson has requested that the site be named "Robert Kronberg Park" and that is the name that the three NDAs are considering. The NDA comments will be forwarded to the Parks Board and a Parks Board recommendation will be sent to Council in February for Council approval.
4. Two proposals related to City of Milwaukie projects were submitted to Metro on Thursday January 12 as Pre- Applications for Nature in the Neighborhoods Grants. One was submitted by the Island Station Neighborhood for wetland enhancements at Spring Park and another was submitted by the Johnson Creek Watershed Council and the City for

enhancement of Klein Point, at the mouth of Johnson Creek. Invitations to submit final grant applications will be announced in mid to late February.

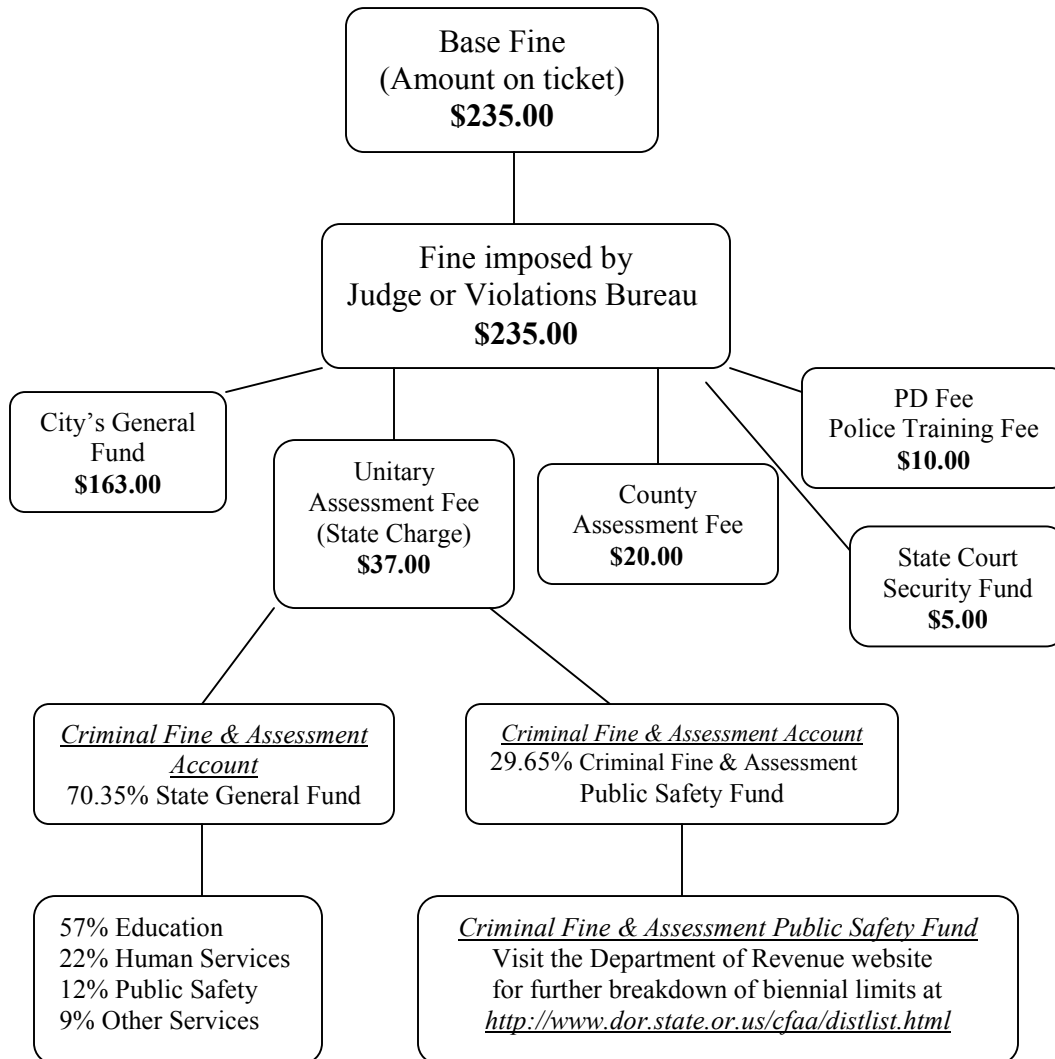
5. The Community Services director will be attending the NDA leadership meeting to discuss the upcoming Metro Open Space Bond and a draft list of projects to be submitted to Metro by March 1. Staff will forward a staff report to Council on this process for Council's February 7 work session. Metro Councilor Brian Newman is scheduled to discuss the bond measure with Council at that meeting.
6. Jay Ostlund has just learned that he successfully passed the exam and is now a licensed Professional Engineer. Congratulations to Jay for this accomplishment!

As of January 1, 2006, Oregon Laws 2005, chapter 804 (HB 2792) increases the county assessment amounts in ORS 137.309 for criminal and violation judgments and requires state and local courts to deposit the increase with the state for a State Court Facilities Security Account.
