

FRIDAY MEMO

March 9, 2007

1. Remember! Daylight savings time starts this weekend. See the March 2 Memo for tips on changing the time on your home and business computers.
2. The first Budget Committee meeting for 2007 – 2008 is scheduled for April 9, 2007, 5:30 p.m. at City Hall. We are planning to have the Proposed Budget and Capital Improvement Plan available for the Committee and the public on March 21.
3. The City Council still has a couple of vacancies on two key advisory boards beginning April 1. There is one vacancy on the Planning Commission and one on the Design and Landmarks Committee. It was with regrets that the Council learned Pat Lent and Pat Healy felt it was time to “retire” when their terms on the Library Board end on March 31. Their positions were quickly filled by Alicia Hamilton and Robert Biswas-Deiner – both identified the importance of the Library to their families and their desire to give back to the community. At its meeting this week Council also reappointed Bob Cooper and Kate MacCready to the Parks and Recreation Board and Ed Miller to the Citizens Utility Advisory Board. 4. Three development proposals were received for the Town Center site in downtown Milwaukie. Proposals to develop the site into a mixed-use residential and retail project were submitted by Costa Pacific Communities, KemperCo LLC, and Winkler Development. If you are interested in taking a look at the proposals, they will be on display from 7 p.m. to 9 p.m. on Tuesday, March 13th in the Public Safety Building Community Meeting Room, 3200 SE Harrison.
5. The City is very proud of its Police Department, and the statistics show the officers’ proactive efforts are paying off. While the numbers of calls increase, the crime rate continues to fall. The attached graph represents the number of incidents police responded to in 2006, it is also broken down by neighborhood. In comparison the Milwaukie Police Department responded to just over 16,000 incidents in 2003 as compared to nearly 22,000 in 2006. The increase of 6,000 incidents represents a 26% increase in police activity over the past three-years. See the attached “2006 Total Calls for Service.”
6. The Ledding Library continues to break its own circulation records. See the attached statistics for January 2007.
7. Work on the Transportation Plan (TSP) continues, and the City wants your input. Here are a few ways to keep informed and stay involved:

8. Milwaukie High School will host a public hearing chaired by Oregon Senator Rick Metsger of the Legislature's Business, Transportation and Workforce Development Committee. The hearing will address two bills currently before the committee: Senate Bill 397, which concerns school attendance, and Senate Bill 2274, which would double traffic fines in safety corridors. The hearing, open to Milwaukie High students and the public, will take place on Friday, March 16 from 10:30 a.m. to 1:45 p.m. (breaking for lunch from 11:45 to 12:15). 9. Rose Marti will be joining City Hall staff on Monday, March 12. She will assist with municipal court, records management, finance, and community services projects. The City is currently recruiting for a new Finance Director.

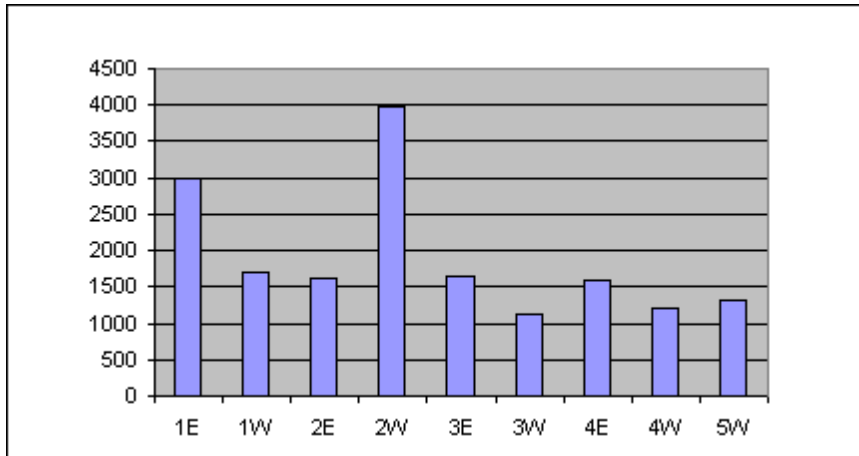

Millennium Clarinets to Conclude First Saturday Season

The Millennium Clarinets, a quartet hailing from Lake Oswego, will perform at the Ledding Library at 2:00PM on Saturday, April 7th. The quartet, comprised of Lea Anne Bantsari, Don Barnes, Dale Cleland and Nancy McIntyre, was formed in 2002 and has been on the go ever since. The *Quartet* has been enthusiastically received wherever they have performed throughout the Portland area – at concerts, wedding receptions and retirement homes. Be prepared for a wonderful hour of all types of music – including jazz, classical and popular standards. As newsletter readers probably know, the clarinet is a musical instrument in the woodwind family. It is the largest family of instruments, with more than two dozen types. Of these, many are rare or obsolete, and music written for them is usually played on one of the more common size instruments. The name *clarinet* comes from adding the suffix *et* meaning *little* to the Italian word *clarion* meaning a particular type of trumpet. At its February 6th meeting, the Milwaukie City Council moved to declare the week of April 15 to 21 as a fine amnesty week at the Ledding Library. During this week, patrons with library fines may have 50¢ of their fines waived for every package or can of food that is brought into the Ledding Library. Lost materials may not be paid for under this program. The food that is collected will be picked up by the Oregon Food Bank and distributed within the local community.

Great Film Documentaries At Ledding Library

I'm sure that you have read many recommendations for Oscar winning feature films, but did you know that Ledding Library has a great selection of Academy Award winning documentaries? Here's a partial list:

Maya Lin: A Strong Clear Vision: This film focuses on the 20 year old Chinese-American woman chosen to design America's Vietnam Memorial in Washington D.C.

It won the best documentary Oscar in 1994.

One Day in September: An unbridled report of the 1972 Munich Olympics when Palestinian Terrorists took the Israeli athletes hostage, this film won best documentary in 1999. After you watch it, check out **Munich**, a dramatization of the Israeli response.

The Fog of War: Eleven Lessons from the Life of

Robert S McNamara: An intimate look at the former Secretary of Defense in the Kennedy and Johnson eras. Combines interviews of Mr. McNamara with historical footage. It features a poignant score by Philip Glass. This film took home the Oscar in 2003.

Born into Brothels: This film chronicles the efforts of two filmmakers to help the children of the prostitutes of Calcutta rise above their abject poverty through the art of photography. It was the winner of the Best Documentary at the Academy Awards of 2004.

March of the Penguins: Every year, the Empire Penguins brave unbelievably hostile conditions to march single file to their breeding grounds in Antarctica. A fascinating portrayal of instinctual nature, this film won in 2005, but what should have won was...

Enron, The Smartest Guys in the Room: This film based on the best selling book, chronicles Enron and its demise. Corrupt executives from the seventh richest company in the world walked away with billions, leaving shareholders penniless.
