

# FRIDAY MEMO

**April 6, 2007**

1. With great sadness Clackamas Fire District #1 announced that District Board Director Ralph "Tiny" Lidstrom passed away on April 4 after a long battle with cancer. He served the District for more than 36 years and was known throughout the state as a "no nonsense" leader dedicated to fire service excellence. He supported and guided the development of fire and emergency medical services in Oregon and personally led Clackamas Fire District #1 through six mergers. He will be missed.

The District will accept applications to replace Mr. Lidstrom for the remainder of his term, which is due to expire June 30, 2009. At this time Milwaukie does not have a representative, so the District is hoping someone from the City will apply. 2. The Board of County Commissioners (BCC) held a planning meeting on April 4, 2007 to begin formulating a policy on the future of library services and funding. The BCC asked staff to pull together a potential proposal/package based upon the following concepts:

- Formulate the 2007-08 budgetary contribution at \$6.785 million to libraries, no 3% increase
- Begin anticipating the impact of the loss of Secure Rural Schools funding on libraries
- Developing a stable funding source for libraries in the form of a countywide service district
- County staff will work to develop a financial and operational model to meet OLA standards for "threshold, adequate, and excellent"
- County staff will explore alternatives to the county's continued direct provision of library services
- The BCC supports the continued operations of the Library Network coordinating the federation of libraries within the county

It is anticipated that staff will complete the proposal for the BCC by April 20, 2007.

3. The City of Milwaukie Budget Committee will hold its first meeting on Monday, April 9, 2007 at 5:30 p.m. in the City Hall Council Chambers. City Manager Mike Swanson will deliver the 2007 – 2008 Budget Message and his balanced budget proposal, and Engineering Director Gary Parkin will review the draft Capital Improvement Plan. Copies of both documents are available for review at Milwaukie City Hall, 10722 SE Main Street, and the Ledding Library, 10660 SE 21<sup>st</sup> Avenue. Dates for subsequent Budget Committee meetings will be set at this first meeting.

5. A series of three meetings have been scheduled throughout Milwaukie to more closely examine the proposed Milwaukie light rail alignment. Each meeting will focus on a specific segment: the southern portion that includes the Island Station and Oak Grove area, the middle portion which focuses on the Historic Milwaukie Neighborhood, and the northern section that focuses on the Ardenwald Neighborhood and the North /Industrial Area. # Milwaukie Police Department

## February 2007 Traffic Report

During the month of February the department responded to 3 injury and 7 non-injury traffic accidents. Milwaukie Police Officers arrested 13 DUII drivers and wrote 685 traffic citations for a total of 854 violations during the month. Of the 685 citations written, 365 were speed related citations. 29 seatbelt citations were written while working under the requirements of the 3Flags grants.

In February officers issued speed related citations at the following listed locations.

**SE 22<sup>nd</sup> & Wren** - the posted speed limit is 25mph at this location. Of the 9 citations written, 6 drivers were cited for 35mph to 39mph, and 3 were cited for 40mph to 44mph, over the speed limit.

**SE River Rd. & Wren** - the posted speed limit is 25mph at this location. Of the 40 citations written, 27 drivers were cited for 35mph to 39mph, 12 were cited for 40mph to 44mph, and 1 was cited for 45mph to 49mph, over the speed limit.

**SE 34<sup>th</sup> & Harrison** - the posted speed limit is 25mph at this location. Of the 10 citations written, 7 drivers were cited for 35mph to 39mph, and 3 were cited for 40mph to 44mph, over the speed limit.

**SE Stanley North of King Rd.** - the posted speed limit is 25mph at this location. Of the 5 citations written, 3 drivers were cited for 35mph to 39mph, and 2 were cited for 45mph to 49mph, over the speed limit.

**SE 55<sup>th</sup> & Johnson Creek Blvd.** - the posted speed limit is 35mph at this location. Of the 25 citations written, 1 was cited for 45mph to 49mph, 1 was cited for 50mph to 54mph, 15 were cited for 60mph to 64mph, 4 were cited for 65mph to 69mph, and 4 were cited for 70mph to 74mph, over the speed limit.

### HYW 224 Corridor

**McLoughlin** - the posted speed limit is 45mph at this location. Of the 2 citations written, 1 driver was cited for 50mph to 54mph, and 1 was cited for 55mph to 59mph, over the speed limit.

**Freeman Way** - the posted speed limit is 50mph at this location. Of the 7 citations written, 7 were cited for 65mph to 69mph over the speed limit.

### McLoughlin Corridor

**Scott Street** - the posted speed limit is 30mph at this location. Of the 109 citations written, 1 driver was cited for 35mph to 39mph, 71 drivers were cited for 40 mph to 44mph, 23 were cited for 45mph to 49mph, and 14 were cited for 50mph to 54mph, over the speed limit.

**Clatsop Street** - the posted speed limit is 45mph at this location. Of the 36 citations written, 13 were cited for 55mph to 59mph, 21 were cited for 60mph to 64mph, 1 was cited for 65mph to 69mph, and 1 was cited for 70mph to 74mph, over the speed limit.

**10300 Block (HYW. 224)** - the posted speed limit is 30mph at this location. Of the 4 citations written, 2 were cited for 55mph to 59mph, 1 was cited for 65mph to 69mph, and 1 was cited for 70mph to 74mph, over the speed limit.

**Moores** - the posted speed limit is 45mph at this location. Of the 8 citations written, 1 was cited for 45mph to 49mph, 5 were cited for 50mph to 54mph, 1 was cited for 55mph to 59mph, and 1 was cited for 60mph to 64mph, over the speed limit.

**Harrison Street** - the posted speed limit is 30mph at this location. Of the 19 citations written, 5 drivers were cited for 40 mph to 44mph, 9 were cited for 45mph to 49mph, 3 were cited for 50mph to 54mph, 1 was cited for 55mph to 59mph, and 1 was cited for 65mph to 69mph, over the speed limit.

**Milport** - the posted speed limit is 45mph at this location. Of the 36 citations written, 2 were cited for 45mph to 49mph, 21 were cited for 55mph to 59mph, 12 were cited for 60mph to 64mph, and 1 was cited for 65mph to 69mph, over the speed limit.

**Monroe** - the posted speed limit is 30mph at this location. Of the 4 citations written, 4 were cited for 45mph to 49mph over the speed limit.

**Ochoco** - the posted speed limit is 45mph at this location. Of the 2 citations written, 1 driver was cited for 50mph to 54mph, and 1 was cited for 55mph to 59mph, over the speed limit.

In the above listed areas 151 citations were written for 10mph to 14mph, 93 citations were written for 15mph to 19mph, 22 citations were written for 20mph to 24mph, 19 citations were written for 25mph to 29mph, 5 citations were written for 30mph to 34mph, and 7 citations were written for 35mph to 40mph, over the posted speed limits. 21 citations were written for speeds below 10mph over the posted speed limits.

A study of vehicle traffic was conducted with High Star traffic monitoring plates near SE 21st and Harrison St. The plates were placed in the Westbound and Eastbound lanes on 02/18/07. The plates were operational up to 02/25/07 and the following information was collected.

The speed limit is 25mph in the study area and the average speed of the 45,355 vehicles counted, was 21mph. At least half of the vehicles were traveling at 24mph or slower and 85 percent of the vehicles were traveling 25mph or slower.

Out of the 45,355 vehicles counted 595 were traveling at speeds that are in the traffic citation range. Based on the information collected it appears that excessive vehicle speeds are just above one percent of the total vehicles counted.
