

# FRIDAY MEMO

**April 20, 2007**

1. The Clackamas Fire District #1 Board has met to discuss the process of replacing Director Tiny Lidstrom who recently passed away. Applications to fill the remainder of his term, which is due to expire June 30, 2009, will be available by Wednesday, April 25. Copies may be obtained either at the District's office, 11300 SE Fuller Road, or on the District's web site. The application form will not be available until that date. Completed applications should be returned by May 18. Residents and those owning property within the District are eligible to fill the vacant term. 2. City Council approved a resolution to begin negotiations with Main Street Partners on a redevelopment agreement for the Town Center site across Main Street from City Hall. The Council selected Main Street Partners over two other development firms that submitted design proposals for the site, owned jointly by the City and Metro. The Main Street Partners concept is to build a three story building on Main Street and a four to five story building on McLoughlin, with condominiums and townhomes on the upper levels and retail and parking at the ground level. The redevelopment agreement, called a Memorandum of Understanding, will spell out the developer's intentions for the project. Items to be covered in the agreement will include public space, green building practices and a performance schedule. The agreement is expected to be presented for Council approval in June.
3. On April 17 Council honored Ed Zumwalt for his tireless efforts in organizing special events for the City. He has been the driving force behind the Riverfest for the past several years in addition to organizing the summer concerts at Scott Park, acting as an officer in the Historic Milwaukie Neighborhood Association, and serving as a member of the Library Board and many other volunteer groups.
4. Street Surface Maintenance Program Update. All City utility customers have received -- or will receive -- a flyer on the Street Maintenance Fee calculation method in their March or April bills. Commercial customers were mailed a detailed letter describing their fee earlier this week. At its April 17 meeting the City Council approved an ordinance establishing a \$.02 per gallon local motor vehicle fuel tax. That tax will go into effect in July 2007. In both cases the revenue generated will be dedicated to repairing Milwaukie's deteriorating streets.
5. It's spring clean up time. On Saturday, May 5th the City of Milwaukie and your local waste haulers will host the 23rd annual Down to Earth Day. Milwaukie City residents are welcome to bring the following materials to the collection event: discarded furniture, unmounted tires, scrap metal, yard debris and general trash. Please bring ID or a Milwaukie water bill to confirm

you live in Milwaukie. The sites are the same as they have been in the past: Linwood Elementary, Ardenwald Elementary, and Lewelling Elementary. Some materials may not be accepted and curbside service for seniors and disabled residents is available on a limited basis. # Milwaukie Police Department

## March 2007 Traffic Report

During the month of March the department responded to 1 Fatal and 3 non-injury traffic accidents. Milwaukie Police Officers arrested 7 DUII drivers and wrote 629 traffic citations. Of the 629 citations written, 423 were speed related. No citations were written while working under the requirements of the 3Flags grants.

The fatal traffic accident occurred on 04/14/07 at 8:08pm. A vehicle traveling westbound on Hyw. 224 struck a pedestrian at or very near to SE Washington St. It has not been determined if the passenger was actually in the crosswalk. At this time no citations have been issued to the driver.

In March officers issued speed related citations at the following listed locations.

**SE 22<sup>nd</sup> & Wren** - the posted speed limit is 25mph at this location. Of the 56 citations written, 36 drivers were cited for 35mph to 39mph, and 20 were cited for 40mph to 44mph, over the speed limit.

**SE River Rd. & Wren** - the posted speed limit is 25mph at this location. Of the 16 citations written, 8 drivers were cited for 35mph to 39mph, 7 were cited for 40mph to 44mph, and 1 was cited for 45mph to 49mph, over the speed limit.

**SE 34<sup>th</sup> & Harrison** - the posted speed limit is 25mph at this location. Of the 7 citations written, 4 drivers were cited for 35mph to 39mph, and 3 were cited for 40mph to 44mph, over the speed limit.

**SE Stanley North of King Rd.** - the posted speed limit is 25mph at this location. Of the 31 citations written, 22 drivers were cited for 35mph to 39mph, 3 were cited for 40mph to 44mph, and 1 was cited for 45mph to 49mph, over the speed limit.

**SE 55<sup>th</sup> & Johnson Creek Blvd.** - the posted speed limit is 35mph at this location. Of the 3 citations written, 2 were cited for 50mph to 54mph, and 1 was cited for 60mph to 64mph, over the speed limit.

**SE 38<sup>th</sup> & Johnson Creek Blvd.** - the posted speed limit is 25mph at this location. 1 was cited for 35mph to 39mph, over the speed limit.

### HYW 224 Corridor

**Monroe** - the posted speed limit is 40mph at this location. Of the 3 citations written, 1 driver was cited for 50mph to 54mph, and 2 were cited for 55mph to 59mph, over the speed limit.

**Oak** - the posted speed limit is 40mph at this location. Of the 2 citations written, 1 driver was cited for 55mph to 59mph, and 1 was cited for 60mph to 64mph, over the speed limit.

**Rusk** - the posted speed limit is 50mph at this location. Of the 10 citations written, 7 drivers were cited for 65mph to 69mph, and 3 were cited for 70mph to 74mph, over the speed limit.

**Lake** - the posted speed limit is 50mph at this location. Of the 45 citations written, 1 driver was cited for 60mph to 64mph, 38 were cited for 65mph to 69mph, 5 were cited for 70mph to 74mph, and 1 was cited for 75mph to 79mph, over the speed limit.

**Freeman Way** - the posted speed limit is 50mph at this location. Of the 10 citations written, 1 driver was cited for 60mph to 64mph, and 9 were cited for 65mph to 69mph, over the speed limit.

#### McLoughlin Corridor

**Scott Street** - the posted speed limit is 30mph at this location. Of the 160 citations written, 2 drivers were cited for 40 mph to 44mph, 87 were cited for 45mph to 49mph, 18 were cited for 50mph to 54mph, 18 was cited for 55mph to 59mph, 3 were cited for 60mph to 64mph, and 1 was cited for 65mph to 69mph, over the speed limit.

**Clatsop Street** - the posted speed limit is 45mph at this location. Of the 30 citations written, 11 were cited for 55mph to 59mph, 15 were cited for 60mph to 64mph, 4 were cited for 65mph to 69mph, and 1 was cited for 70mph to 74mph, over the speed limit.

**10300 Block (HYW. 224)** - the posted speed limit is 30mph at this location. 2 were cited for 45mph to 49mph, over the speed limit.

**Harrison Street** - the posted speed limit is 30mph at this location. Of the 29 citations written, 4 drivers were cited for 40 mph to 44mph, 17 were cited for 45mph to 49mph, 7 were cited for 50mph to 54mph, and 1 was cited for 55mph to 59mph, over the speed limit.

**Milport** - the posted speed limit is 45mph at this location. Of the 15 citations written, 1 was cited for 50mph to 54mph, 10 were cited for 55mph to 59mph, 3 were cited for 60mph to 64mph, and 1 was cited for 75mph to 79mph, over the speed limit.

**Monroe** - the posted speed limit is 30mph at this location. 1 driver was cited for 60mph to 64mph over the speed limit.

**Jefferson** - the posted speed limit is 30mph at this location. Of the 2 citations written, 1 driver was cited for 40mph to 44mph, and 1 was cited for 45mph to 49mph over the speed limit.

**Ochoco** - the posted speed limit is 45mph at this location. Of the 3 citations written, 1 driver was cited for 60mph to 64mph, and 2 were cited for 65mph to 69mph, over the speed limit.

In the above listed areas 103 citations were written for 10mph to 14mph, 238 citations were written for 15mph to 19mph, 42 citations were written for 20mph to 24mph, 22 citations were written for 25mph to 29mph, 5 citations were written for 30mph to 34mph, and 1 citation was written for 35mph to 40mph, over the posted speed limits. 1 citation was written for speeds below 10mph over the posted speed limits.

Since the police department has began stepped up traffic enforcement in the areas listed we have been receiving complaints from persons about speed traps and rude officers in the City of Milwaukie. The police department has investigated the complaints and none of them have been found as valid.

One evening in early March unknown subjects dumped nails in the parking lot of the Public Safety Building and on a cement pad at the intersection of SE Harrison & McLoughlin. This was an obvious attempt to damage police vehicle tires by someone who was not happy about our increased traffic enforcement efforts on McLoughlin Blvd.

A study of vehicle traffic was conducted with High Star traffic monitoring plates near SE 40th and Drake St. The plates were placed in the Northbound and Southbound lanes on 03/04/07. The plates were operational up to 03/11/07 and the following information was collected.

The speed limit is 25mph in the study area and the average speed of the 20,837 vehicles counted was 28mph. At least half of the vehicles were traveling at 29mph or slower and 85 percent of the vehicles were traveling 35mph or slower.

We also attempted to use our traffic survey plates on SE 22<sup>nd</sup> ave. south of River Rd. While the plates were in place, one of them was stolen. The department originally purchased four of the plates. Last year one of the plates was stolen off of SE 22<sup>nd</sup> and now we have had a second one stolen from the same location by prying it out of the street. We are attempting to receive more plates from the city engineering department.
