

MIKE'S FRIDAY MEMO

AUGUST 3, 2007

1. At its Tuesday August 7th meeting, Council will hear a report from city and project staff on the recently completed review of Main Street as a possible light rail alignment in downtown Milwaukie. The report will summarize two design workshops held in July at Milwaukie High School, along with TriMet and Metro's technical review of design considerations. Staff will present a recommendation to council about inclusion of a Main Street alignment in the current South Corridor Phase 2 Supplemental Draft Environmental Impact Statement study. The council will advise the Mayor, who represents Milwaukie on the South Corridor Policy Steering Committee, and who is expected to forward a recommendation to that Committee about the Main Street option on August 13th.
2. State Rep. Carolyn Tomei will hold a Town Hall meeting in the Milwaukie City Hall Council Chambers on Saturday, August 4 from 10 a.m. to 11:30 a.m. City Hall is located at 10722 SE Main Street.
3. The Island Station Neighborhood Association is holding its annual picnic and National Night Out celebration at 6 p.m. on Tuesday, August 7 at Spring Park. Chicken and soft drinks will be provided, and participants are encouraged to bring a dessert or salad. The Johnson Creek Brass Band will perform. Spring Park is located at the end of 19th Avenue at Sparrow Street in the Island Station Neighborhood.
4. The Historic Milwaukie Neighborhood Association has its picnic on Friday, August 10 at the Portland Waldorf School.
5. Music abounds this summer at free neighborhood concerts. The Touchables will play the super hits of the '60's at the August 8 Scott Park Noon Concert. Scott Park is located next to the Ledding Library at 10660 SE 21st Avenue. These free concerts run through August 29. What caught her eye: The whole market. This community market on the southern edge of Portland bustles with activity on a Sunday morning and, unlike some of Portland’s markets that cater mostly to the foodie crowd, this market attracts regular folks looking for fresh berries, fruit and greens. There are also lots of prepared-food stalls, so families are gathered for munching at the tables under the covered tents. Also unlike many other markets, craft booths featuring such things as pottery, handmade sandals and decorative signs are sandwiched between the stalls with Walla Walla sweets and garden plants.

You'll recognize vendors from other markets, such as Sweet Leaf Farm, Rogue Creamery, French Prairie Perennials and Sweet Briar Farms pork, taking advantage of the Sunday schedule. Then there are vendors from close by, such as Kaleng's Produce from Canby, who have gorgeous long beets that, like their rounder red cousins, would be fabulous pickled and mixed with fresh garden greens or on their own with blue cheese and candied walnuts. And recent transplant (from Boise) Tiffany Roupai has a booth called Good Indian Girls Do Design! with a line of intricately illustrated cards that she screen-prints by hand on molded paper she buys from Italy. Her background in biology and plant genetics informs many of her designs, and she's finding an audience among Milwaukie market-goers for her brightly colored and reasonably priced cards.

9. Remember to stop by the Friends of the Ledding Library "Booktique" at the Farmers' Market to find quality books and videos at affordable prices. All purchases are donations, and the proceeds support Library programs with special emphasis on children, families, arts, and culture. The next step is a year-round bookshop at the Library Pond House. Other Library events include:

July 2007 Ledding Library Monthly Report

Facility and Grounds:

- On July 11, 2007, Friends President Carol Kay, City of Milwaukie Facilities staff person Willie Miller and Library Director Joe Sandfort met at the Library Pond House to discuss its various uses and to make plans for its future. The Friends would like to open a bookstore in the garage of the Pond House beginning in November 2007. The structure of the Pond House is safe, and the City's Planning Department has been consulted to ascertain whether or not a retail use for the property would comply with current zoning regulations. The Friends have suggested that a sign identifying the Pond House be placed in its front yard and that the sign match the style of the library sign at SE 21st and SE Harrison. The Planning Department is studying the sign request as well.
- Circulation Supervisor Nancy Wittig, Joe Sandfort and Community Services Program Coordinator Beth Ragel met with Lorraine Griffey, a relative of the Measure family who donated the wall and fountain in Scott Park to the City. Ms Griffey stressed that the Measures were very important to her and that a monument to them should remain in some form. Ms Griffey was open to the idea of dismantling the Measure Monument, currently in the back of Scott Park, with some of the stones being used for a bench that would be placed near the Peake Fountain. Other options, including lighting and landscaping at the current site are being explored as well.

Library Network Issues:

- The Strategic Action Plan Subcommittee's (SAPS) report entitled Library Funding Solutions is now being studied by the Board of County Commissioners. The report called for the removal of county funding from the county libraries and proposed the formation of a library district.

Library Activities

- Circulation Supervisor Nancy Wittig announced another record-breaking month. July 2007 now has the distinction of being the busiest July in the history of the Ledding Library. 49,074 items were checked out by Ledding Library patrons, a 2.37% increase over July 2006. Several library collections experienced large increases in their circulation totals: periodicals, DVDs and talking books on CD did particularly well. The amount of fines taken in, \$5,435.24, was a 52% increase over the figure for the previous July. Ms Wittig credits the credit/debit machine for this phenomenon.

- Supervising Librarian Jana Hoffman announced that as of the afternoon of August 1, 1,040 children have enrolled in the Summer Reading Program, as have 272 teens for a grand total of 1,312 participants. Everyone associated with the Summer Reading Program should be proud of its success.
- Valerie Warner, the City of Milwaukie's new Finance Director visited the Library on July 24 and was given a tour of the facility.

Notes from Mayor Jim Bernard Friday Memo August 3, 2007

This week I had the honor of serving as the host of the North Clackamas Chamber legislative wrap up. Eight of our Senators and Representatives addressed some of the strengths and weaknesses of this year's session including Measure 37 fixes and transportation funding. As you may know there will be a ballot measure attempting to fix some portions of Measure 37. Most felt it was not enough, and some felt it didn't need fixing. As far as transportation there was discussion about the lack of funding for maintenance and for projects of statewide significance. How will we fund these needs? Should there be a gas tax increase or vehicle registration fee? With the bridge collapse earlier this week in Minneapolis and the fact that the State of Oregon has 33 bridges with the same design and the Sellwood Bridge which currently needs replacement, how will these replacement or repairs be funded?

I am in Salem this weekend at the Oregon Mayors' Association Conference with fellow Mayors who all with the same issues. I have talked to at least 10 Mayors who are looking at Milwaukie's model for road maintenance funding and with Oregon City Mayor Alice Norris about fire service funding. We also have in common issues such as sewer service, water supply, and budget shortfalls. I am proud to tell them how great Milwaukie is doing in almost all these areas. Our conference agenda includes public/private partnerships and meetings with State Agency heads including Ray Naff, Intergovernmental Relations, Bob Repine, Economic and Community Development, and Louise Solliday, Director, State Lands.

Milwaukie Police Department

June 2007 Traffic Report

During the month of June the department responded to 3 injury and 10 non-injury traffic accidents. Milwaukie Police Officers arrested 8 DUII drivers and wrote 369 traffic citations. Of the 369 citations written, 133 were speed related.

During the last week of May and the first week of June The Milwaukie Police Department conducted increased patrols within the city concentrating on seatbelt enforcement. The increased patrols were funded through ODOT grant funds with the intent of decreasing traffic injuries and deaths.

During the seatbelt blitz Milwaukie Police Officers worked 31 hours of grant overtime and wrote 42 seatbelt citations. They also wrote 20 citations for other violations. A seatbelt survey conducted in Milwaukie on 05/21/07 (pre-blitz) showed that 87% of drivers/passengers were wearing seatbelts. A seatbelt survey conducted in Milwaukie on 06/04/07 (post-blitz) showed that 94% of drivers/passengers were wearing seatbelts.

In June officers issued speed related citations at the following listed locations.

SE River Rd. & Wren - the posted speed limit is 25mph at this location. 12 citations were written for vehicles traveling at 35mph to 39mph, 8 citations were written for vehicles traveling at 40mph to 44mph, and 2 citations were written for vehicles traveling at 45mph to 49mph.

SE 34th & Harrison - the posted speed limit is 25mph at this location. 4 citations were written for vehicles traveling at 35mph to 39mph, 3 citations were written for vehicles traveling at 40mph to 44mph, and 1 citation was written for vehicles traveling at 50mph to 59mph.

SE JCB & 55th - the posted speed limit is 35mph at this location. 3 citations were written for vehicles traveling at 50mph to 54mph.

HYW 224 Corridor

Rusk - the posted speed limit is 50mph at this location. 1 citation was written for vehicles traveling at 65mph to 69mph.

Freeman - the posted speed limit is 50mph at this location. 1 citation was written for vehicles traveling at 70mph to 74mph.

Lake - the posted speed limit is 50mph at this location. 12 citations were written for vehicles traveling at 65mph to 69mph, and 2 citations were written for vehicles traveling at 70mph to 74mph.

McLoughlin Corridor

Scott Street - the posted speed limit is 30mph at this location. 10 citations were written for vehicles traveling at 45mph to 49mph, 72 citations were written for vehicles traveling at 50mph to 54mph, 4 citations were written for vehicles traveling at 55mph to 59mph, 1 citation was written for vehicles traveling at 60mph to 64mph, and 1 citation was written for vehicles traveling at 65mph to 69mph.

Clatsop Street - the posted speed limit is 45mph at this location. 4 citations were written for vehicles traveling at 55mph to 59mph, 8 citations were written for vehicles traveling at 60mph to 64mph, 2 citations were written for vehicles traveling at 65mph to 69mph, and 1 citations was written for vehicles traveling at 70mph to 74mph.

Harrison Street - the posted speed limit is 30mph at this location. 2 citations were written for vehicles traveling at 40mph to 44mph, 6 citations were written for vehicles traveling at 45mph to 49mph, 1 citation was written for vehicles traveling at 50mph to 54mph, and 1 citation was written for vehicles traveling at 55mph to 59mph.

Milport - the posted speed limit is 45mph at this location. 2 citations were written for vehicles traveling at 55mph to 59mph, 12 citations were written for vehicles traveling at 60mph to 64mph, 2 citations were written for vehicles traveling at 65mph to 69mph, and 2 citations were written for vehicles traveling at 70mph to 74mph.

Scott - the posted speed limit is 30mph at this location. 1 citation was written for vehicles traveling at 40mph to 44mph, 9 citations were written for vehicles traveling at 45mph to 49mph, 5 citations were written for vehicles traveling at 50mph to 54mph, and 2 citations were written for vehicles traveling at 55mph to 59mph.

In the above listed areas 25 citations were written for 10mph to 14mph, 42 citations were written for 15mph to 19mph, 15 citations were written for 20mph to 24mph, and 7 citations were written for 25mph to 29mph, over the posted speed limits.
