

MIKE'S FRIDAY MEMO

AUGUST 24, 2007

1. City facilities including the Milwaukie Ledding Library will be closed on Monday September 3 in observance of Labor Day.
2. The Evelyn Zanon Memorial Bench was installed last Saturday at the Ledding Library. The 4-foot teak bench is situated on the south end of the Library's front entrance among the colorful new planters, and staff is in the process of ordering a memorial plaque. Ms. Zanon was a life-long Library user and loved it and all the services it offered the community. When she passed away earlier this year, she left about \$32,000 to the Ledding Library, and a portion of that money is being used to purchase the bench and plaque in her memory. There is also a stone on the Peake Memorial Fountain in her honor.
3. The Ledding Library is collecting new and gently used school supplies for the North Clackamas School District. The items most needed are: #2 pencils, notebook paper (wide & college ruled), rulers, Elmer's glue, 5" scissors, glue sticks, erasers, markers (washable, wide and thin), 16 or 24 set of crayons, Kleenex, antibacterial wipes, and packages of printer paper (unlined).
4. Listen to *3 Hours in Paris* performing modern rock on August 29 at the season finale of the Scott Park Noon Concert series. Papa Murphy's is serving up generous slices of pizza for \$1, and the Friends of the Library are selling soft drinks, juice, water, and a variety of snacks. Scott Park is located next to the Ledding Library at 10660 SE 21st Avenue.
5. In 2006 City Council passed a Street Surface Maintenance Program (SSMP) to protect our roads - a public asset worth more than \$65 million dollars. The program took effect this July and the program is already at work. In August crews completed repairs to 37th Avenue from Lake Road to Highway 224 and 42nd Avenue from Johnson Creek Boulevard to Harvey. On 37th Avenue crews leveled the asphalt to smooth the roadway's heavy ruts and then added a two-inch overlay. On 42nd the roadway was overlaid in one section, and ground down in another before the whole section was paved with a two-inch overlay.

The SSMP will next target Oak Street between Highway 224 and Monroe and King Road from 43rd Avenue to Hollywood. This work is scheduled for fall of 2007 through summer of 2008.

6. On August 15 the Milwaukie Police Department and Milwaukie Public Safety Advisory Committee sponsored a special meeting where residents could air their concerns about the proposed Oxford House in the Ardenwald Neighborhood. Milwaukie Police Chief moderated the forum where neighbors were able to ask him and Oxford House residents and representatives their questions. Replays of this meeting are at 3:30 a.m., 9 a.m., 2:30 p.m., 4:30 p.m. and 10:22 p.m. on Channel 30.

7. Councilor Deborah Barnes is the City's representative to Water Environment Services' Community Wastewater Solutions Committee. To read her comments on the most recent meeting, see attachment #3 to this memo.
8. The City Council appointed Parker Fitzpatrick to the Design and Landmarks Committee and David Hedges to the Public Safety Advisory Board. Milwaukie is very fortunate to have so many wonderful volunteers. If you would like to get involved there is one vacant position on the Park and Recreation Board. 9. The Sunday Farmers' Market is a great place to buy peak-of-the-season local produce, fresh fish, seafood, meats, pastries, artisan breads, and cheeses. There's a wonderful selection of crafts as well as plants for your yard and patio and cut flowers for your home. Sit back and enjoy live music while sampling some tasty offerings from the numerous food vendors. The Market is every Sunday from now through October in the parking lot across from City Hall. The hours are 9:30 a.m. to 2 p.m., and there's plenty of free parking.

Word has it that plans are afoot for the 2nd annual pumpkin carving contest at the last Sunday Market of the season on October 28. Watch for details on how to enter.

Friendly volunteers are working the Friends of the Ledding Library "Booktique" booth at the Market where you can find all sorts of quality books and videos at affordable prices. All purchases are donations with the proceeds going to Library programs. The Friends are looking forward to using the Pond House on Harrison Street for its Booktique at the close of the Market season.

10. On August 13 Milwaukie Pioneer Cemetery Trustee Dolly Macken-Hambright sent the following e-mail. Subject Line -- The Great Chicken Caper (or was it capon?) "On Friday, 8/10, some of our cemetery assoc. members were in the process of returning our riding lawn mower back to the Milwaukie Pioneer Cemetery and discovered that someone had left a rather large and unusual offering. Strategically hidden under our leaf catcher attachment, was 240 lbs. of rock-solid, frozen chicken! It was still in all of the boxes and bags and quite neatly stacked (hadn't even begun to thaw)... either for the cemetery residents to use as needed, or perhaps the person(s) that left it meant to retrieve it at a later time??? In any case, we contacted Officer Huteson of the Milw. PD and the lads came and photographed the evidence. One of our members contacted a local group that feeds homeless folks for freezer space... and the last we heard, volunteers were busily frying chicken for their constituents! July 2007 Traffic Report

During the month of July the department responded to 19 non-injury traffic accidents. Milwaukie Police Officers arrested 13 DUII drivers and wrote 481 traffic citations. Of the 481 citations written, 207 were speed related.

During the month of July The Milwaukie Police Department participated in seven M.A.T.T. Details. The details were held in Clackamas County, Canby, Lake Oswego, West Linn, Molalla, and Milwaukie. The Milwaukie detail was held on 07/16/07 during the hours of 11 am to 4 pm.

The Milwaukie detail conducted 80 traffic stops issuing 106 citations and 38 warnings. During the detail 21 citations were written for speeding violations, 9 citations were written for seatbelt violations, and 38 other assorted violations. The next Milwaukie M.A.T.T. detail will be held August 20th, 2007.

Milport - the posted speed limit is 45mph at this location. 3 citations were written for vehicles traveling at 55mph to 59mph, 20 citations were written for vehicles traveling at 60mph to 64mph, 5 citations were written for vehicles traveling at 65mph to 69mph, 2 citations were written for vehicles traveling at 70mph to 74mph, and 1 citation was written for vehicles traveling at 75mph to 79mph.

Moore - the posted speed limit is 45mph at this location. 1 citation was written for vehicles traveling at 60mph to 64mph.

Jefferson - the posted speed limit is 30mph at this location. 1 citation was written for vehicles traveling at 40mph to 44mph, and 1 citation was written for vehicles traveling at 45mph to 49mph.

Washington - the posted speed limit is 30mph at this location. 1 citation was written for vehicles traveling at 40mph to 44mph, 4 citations were written for vehicles traveling at 45mph to 49mph, and 1 citation was written for vehicles traveling at 50mph to 54mph.

In the above listed areas 20 citations were written for 10mph to 14mph, 88 citations were written for 15mph to 19mph, 14 citations were written for 20mph to 24mph, 5 citations were written for 25mph to 29mph, 1 citation was written for 30mph to 34mph, and 1 citation was written for 40mph to 44mph, over the posted speed limits.

Representatives from the CAC, Damascus, Oak Lodge and Milwaukie were scheduled to meet at WES offices Thursday night with Mediator Carie Fox. Unfortunately, Jim Knapp and Paul Savas did not show up for the group discussion. Carie, fortunately, went ahead with the meeting. Special thanks to WES' Mike Kenzi for clarification on a number of issues.

Updates

1. The BCC decided on Thursday, over the objections of the CAC, to approve the engineer contracts for the interim capacity plan. This plan includes final engineering for interim improvements to Kellogg, new major upgrades to the Tri-Cities plant and a new diversion from Clackamas to Tri-Cities. This means an increase in the diversion transmission capacity where sewage that would be going to Kellogg is now going to be diverted to Tri-Cities. This is good news for Kellogg.
2. The Siting Committee is basically down to three new site proposals. The next step in the process is to determine the costs and rates for the models. The BCC is expected to decide in November to either go ahead with a new site or scrap the idea and go with regionalization. (Rumor has it that it will be regionalization).
3. The focus now is on interim capacity which gives the region and WES staff time to explore what to do 8-10 years from now.
4. The CAC group was formed under a board order. That means a new board order could change things dramatically. Four members of the board are up in January. The other three are up in a year.
5. The focus of the community solutions group is to discuss equity and agree on the rules to be consistent for all stakeholders.
6. According to WES, Milwaukie has four options open to it now...
 - A. We currently opay for operations and maintenance with our current situation with CCSD. One option would be to stay with CCSD and we can expect to see changes and rate increases because of an upcoming change that will mean a capital surcharge and a new risk premium cost to Milwaukie. Or..
 - B. We annex to CCSD and will probably see a rate increase.
 - C. We connect via pipeline to Tri-Cities as a wholesale customer and expect to come up with about \$50 million to build a new pipeline along the Trolley Trail.
 - D. We annex to Oak Lodge (don't think that is even on the table for us).

So, that is what is happening at this point. Disappointed that Jim Knapp and Paul Savas were not able to attend so we could have continued our discussion.
