

MIKE'S FRIDAY MEMO

April 25, 2008

1. At a ceremony on April 24 Del Monte Pet Products and Albertson's presented the Milwaukie Police Department with a \$5,000 donation to help reinstate the City's K-9 program. The Milk-Bone Canine Heroes Program has donated 700 police and service dogs since 1997. This donation is the final event in the effort that was successful in raising the \$25,000 to restart the program.
2. The Measure Bench Dedication is tomorrow morning, April 26 at 11 a.m. on the Ledding Library grounds, 10660 SE 21st Avenue. Lou and Alice Measure were Milwaukie residents who took great pride in their community, and this is a fitting tribute to these fine people. Come by the Library to see this beautiful addition to the landscape.
3. With the arrival of spring weather, the Lee Kelly Fountain is cleaned and operating. The Peake family donated the sculpture in the late 1970's, and during the summer of 2006 the City built a brick and concrete structure to set off this lovely piece. It's on the south side of the Ledding Library on Harrison Street – well worth the visit.
4. With Milwaukie staff beginning to formulate its recommendation for downtown station locations, staff is scheduling another meeting for Monday, April 28th, in the Milwaukie High School Commons at 6 p.m. to get a better sense of which locations residents prefer. More than 75 residents attended a meeting in March where a lot of good input was gathered, but staff is hoping to hear more from the community about preferences between the potential stations located where the alignment intersects Harrison Street, Monroe Street, Washington Street and Lake Road. Staff is also interested in hearing more on the question of "one downtown station or two." This will be the last public meeting where residents will have the opportunity to talk with staff about station locations before it presents a recommendation to City Council. New materials are being prepared for the April 28th meeting to help people visualize how these stations would sit along the alignment near the locations noted above. The meeting will have a "listening post" format where staff will try to answer simple questions, but will mostly be taking notes and listening. The meeting will begin at 6 p.m. and will last long enough to provide everyone an opportunity to speak.
5. The Milwaukie Budget Committee will hold its first meeting of the 2008/2009 budget year on April 29, at 6 p.m. in the City Hall Council Chambers, 10722 SE Main Street. Budget Officer Mike Swanson will deliver his Budget Message to the Committee and community, and copies of the proposed annual budget will be available. It will be televised live on Channel 30. Watch the City website for more information.
6. North Clackamas Parks and Recreation District is holding a series of meetings during April and May to review preliminary designs for the Trolley

Trail. The meeting that focuses on the Milwaukie section of the Trail – Kellogg Creek to Park Avenue – is scheduled for April 29 at 6 p.m. at the Public Safety Building, 3200 SE Harrison. Trolley Trail construction is scheduled to begin by 2010. Questions, suggestions, or comments may be sent to Michelle Healy by e-mail michelleheala@co.clackamas.or.us or call 503.794.8004.

7. The Milwaukie Museum is holding its annual open house on Friday, May 9 from 3 p.m. to 8 p.m. An updated version of the publication “Milwaukie Cemetery Comes to Life” will be available. It was originally published in 2003 and will contain new material. For those who purchased the book previously, new pages have been printed. The Museum is located at 3737 SE Adams Street, just off Railroad Avenue.
8. The 6th Annual Friends of the Library Plant Sale is on Saturday, May 10 from 8:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. at the Pond House, 2215 SE Harrison Street. Organizers promise a wide array of plants, perennials, indoor varieties, and shrubs at great prices. In addition there will be a variety of non-plant items for sale including vases, pots, and gardening books.
9. Sunday May 11 is opening day for the 10th season of the Milwaukie Farmers’ Market. It’s noted for its family-friendly atmosphere, so join your friends and neighbors from 9:30 a.m. to 2 p.m. in the City Hall parking lot in downtown Milwaukie and support local farmers, growers, and artisans. 10. The Milwaukie Poetry Series continues on Wednesday, May 14 with noted Oregon poet Vern Rutsala reading from his works. The reading will start at 7 p.m. at the Ledding Library Pond House, 2215 SE Harrison Street. Mr. Rutsala is the author of twelve collections of poetry, including *The Window*, *Laments*, *The Journey Begins*, and *Little-Known Sports*. Among the awards for his work are a Guggenheim Fellowship, two NEA grants, the Juniper Prize, an Oregon Book Award, two Carolyn Kizer Poetry Prizes, the Duncan Lawrie Prize, a Pushcart Prize, the Akron Poetry Prize, the Northwest Poetry Prize, and a Masters Fellowship from the Oregon Arts Commission. One poetry critic noted that Vern Rutsala presents poetry that has “scintillating visions of life, home, work, and family expressed in accessible language through which the poet magnifies daily events into art.” This event is supported in part by a grant from the Clackamas County Cultural Coalition and the Oregon Cultural Trust.
11. Planning Director Katie Mangle announced that the 2007 Milwaukie Transportation System Plan (TSP), which many citizens helped create, was awarded the Professional Achievement in Planning Award from the Oregon Chapter of the American Planning Association. The review criteria included innovation, transferability, quality, implementation, and professionalism. The award will be presented at the 2008 Oregon Planning Conference at PSU on May 14. Katie says, “I consider this to be an award that recognizes Milwaukie’s elected and community leaders, all of our energetic staff, and this

community's dedication to defining its own future. I will be proud to represent all of you in accepting this award.”

- Attending the Island Station Neighborhood Association meeting.
- Meeting with residents of Milwaukie and Oak Grove to discuss light rail issues.
- Joining the effort that Dion Sheppard and Val Hubbard organized to clean up downtown. The place is looking much nicer thanks to their efforts.
- Joining the Mayor and city staff to honor the volunteers who give so much of their time to make the city a better place in which to live.
- Attending the Riverfront Board meeting to learn about the history of the waterfront from Madalaine Bohl.
- Touring the new NatureBake operation that has moved into the space that Bob's Red Mill left when Bob's Red Mill moved into its larger quarters. We're becoming quite the grain capital.

Meeting Minutes—April 19, 2008—



1. In attendance—Mark Neubauer, President; Madalaine Bohl, Board/Historical Soc./Museum Dir.; Dolly Macken-Hambright, sec/treas.; Rob Hambright, Consultant; Keith and Kathy Neubauer, members.
 2. Minutes from last meeting were not approved. Will be done next meeting.
 3. Treasurer's report: balances to date—checking \$978.33, savings \$6518.63 and petty cash fund \$14.04. There are no outstanding bills at this time.
 4. Dolly has ordered the porta potty for the Memorial Day weekend. Again this year, Mike's has agreed to donate a unit to us.
 5. Engraved plaques will be installed as weather permits. Regarding the picnic table we will be re-using the table legs and replacing the top with cedar. We have allocated the balance of the Jim Wiley Memorial Fund for this purpose which gives \$165.00 for the project. It was felt that this should be sufficient for the re-build at 6' in length. The table will be removed from the cemetery while work is being done and hauled back when complete.
Keith, Mark and Rob will complete the table before Memorial Day, 2008.
 6. Boy Scout Troop #143 has obtained a replacement ball topper and halyard for the flagpole (total cost, about \$50.00) and the pole has been re-painted. The new parts will be installed April 26th, weather permitting. Paint was donated by Keith and Kathy Neubauer.
 7. **Mark will measure the appropriate plots in order to obtain a correct amount of barkdust before Memorial Day, and agreed to check around for donations or best price. The barkdust will be spread by the Scouts on May 10. We can have Stacy pick up and deliver same if necessary, or use our trailer and leave it at the cemetery just before the Scouts are due.**
 8. **The Spring, 2008 clean-up schedule is (weather permitting, of course):**

 9. We have received an estimate from General Tree Svc. for the work that needs to be done to make the cemetery trees safer and to keep them healthy. For all of the firs and cedars, a "hazard prune" only would be \$4400.00, if the work includes wind-trimming to cut down on wind resistance, the cost would be \$6900.00. To remove one of the large holly trees would be an additional \$315.00, and to do work on the maple and arborvitae would add an additional \$400.00. Dolly has the fully diagrammed estimate, which seems to be inclusive. General tree Svc. also offers a grant (application due January, 2009) which would cover the work to be done that is not considered "emergency", and Dolly will follow up with this if we decide to pursue doing the most necessary work this year and by General Tree Svc. **The Board will evaluate the trees at the next clean-up day in order to determine best guess on what absolutely must be done this year.**
 10. It was unanimously voted that the Whitaker marker may be completed as requested. **Dolly will advise the folks who want to have the engraving done that they may move forward with the assurance that a Trustee will be on site while the work is being done.**
 11. **Madalaine will confirm date and time that the Oak Lodge Garden Club will be planting flowers around the flagpole for this year's Memorial Day.** We would like to get photos of the work being done for the newsletter so we will try to be on hand for this.
 12. We have a request that a dogwood or other small tree be planted as a memorial in the cemetery. It was agreed that this would be fine, as long as the Board agreed to the location. This is also the reason for considering the removal of a holly tree, of which we have several. If it is not feasible to plant the dogwood, we agreed to accept a Japanese lace-leaf maple instead.
 13. One of the members reported that when arriving at the cemetery on Sunday, April 13, he disturbed a "camper", with bag and baggage, sleeping there. The camper vacated the premises without incident. **Dolly will contact the Milwaukie PD to advise them of this.**
 11. **The next meeting was scheduled for May 10, 11:00AM, at the Museum..**
