Citizens can anonymously drop off unneeded or expired prescription drugs for safe disposal and keep them out of landfills and our waterways.

She teaches writing and literature at Portland State University and the University of Portland as well as through writers-in-the-schools programs.

Her writing has appeared in *Tin House*, *Climbing*, *FIELD*, *AGNI* online, *The Burnside Review* and elsewhere, and her debut poetry collection, *This Dirty Little Heart* (Eastern Washington University Press), won the 2007 Blue Lynx Prize for Poetry. She is learning to play the mandolin and wishes she could

sing like Gillian Welch. She recommends the marionberry pie at the Bipartisan Cafe on SE Stark in Portland. She is afraid of staplers.

Poetry readings are scheduled from now through June on the second Wednesday of each month. The mission of the Poetry Committee and Project Director Tom Hogan is to make poetry more accessible to all members of the community, so we hope you will attend another great night of poetry. - City Council directed staff to prepare an ordinance for its April 20 meeting implementing a truancy court in the City.

In the regular session:

- Clackamas Community College Board member Carlotta Collette provided an update on programs offered at the College;
- Staff discussed proposed code modifications that would enhance the City's enforcement of illicit discharges into Milwaukie's stormwater system. The ordinance will be considered at the April 20 meeting;
- Contracts were approved for the Linwood Avenue Paving Project and the Decant Facility at the Johnson Creek facility;
- Council approved a contract with Walker Macy/LMN for South Downtown planning phase 4; and
- The Mayor and City Council directed staff to prepare a resolution appointing JoAnne Bird to the Public Safety Advisory Committee to represent Island Station.
